LEARNING BOX OF UNPLUGGED ACTIVITIES

The digital subscriptions overlap

In this unplugged activity, participants analyze a set of fictional digital subscription plans (such as streaming platforms, news services, music apps, and cloud storage accounts) to identify overlaps, redundancies, and opportunities for optimization. Working individually or in groups, they compare the features included in each subscription, detect duplicated services, and decide how to reorganize the subscriptions in the most efficient way.

Learning Objectives

Identify and analyze overlapping information across multiple sources to detect redundancies and inefficiencies

Apply decomposition to break down a complex scenario into manageable components for analysis

Use pattern recognition to compare elements and identify recurring features or duplicated resources

Apply abstraction to distinguish relevant decision-making data from irrelevant details

Evaluate alternatives and justify the most efficient solution based on defined criteria

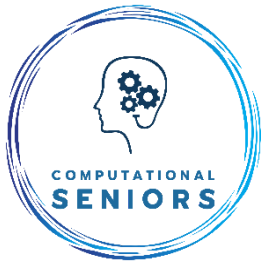

Notes

Keep the number of subscriptions manageable to avoid cognitive overload, especially for beginners.

Ensure that some overlaps are obvious and others are less visible, encouraging deeper analysis.

Encourage discussion about why certain subscriptions should be kept, combined, or removed.



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The digital subscription overlap

Step 1: Understand and organize the subscriptions

Participants receive a set of fictional digital subscriptions (e.g., video streaming, music streaming, cloud storage, online news, fitness or learning apps). Each subscription includes details such as cost, main features, and typical usage.

Participants first read and carefully organize the information in a structured way (for example, a table or grouped list). They identify what each service actually provides and clarify any unclear terms.

Computational thinking focus: Decomposition, breaking a complex system into smaller, understandable parts.

Step 2: Compare and detect overlaps

Participants compare all subscriptions to identify similarities and redundancies between services. They look for cases where different subscriptions offer the same or very similar functionality (e.g., multiple music platforms or overlapping storage services).

They should also consider how often each service is used or needed, and which ones provide unique value versus duplicated value. Highlighting or grouping similar services can help support this analysis.

Computational thinking focus: Pattern recognition and abstraction, identifying repeated structures and focusing only on relevant decision-making criteria (cost, usefulness, frequency of use).

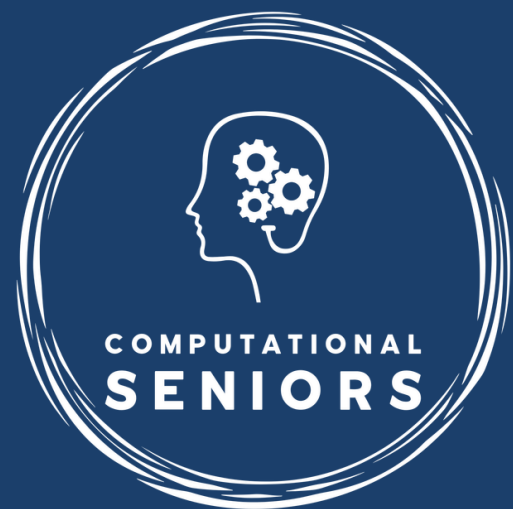
Step 3: Optimize and justify decisions

Based on their analysis, participants decide how to optimize the subscription set: which services to keep, cancel, or potentially merge. They must ensure that essential needs are still covered while reducing unnecessary overlap and cost.

Participants then explain their solution by describing a

clear reasoning process or “decision algorithm” they followed. Different solutions are possible, as long as they are logically justified.

Computational thinking focus: Algorithmic thinking – designing a step-by-step strategy to solve a real-world optimization problem.
